Sir,

A notice has appeared in the press that Mr R. J. Sturdy, chief veterinary surgeon, British East Africa, has returned from an official visit of exploration in Abyssinia. Doubtless he has secured much valuable information about the live stock of that important section of the country, and taken photographs which will make his reports additionally valuable. I am writing a book on "Tropical and Sub-tropical Live Stock" and I write to express the desire in the interests of science that I may be privileged with your permission to participate in the advantages to be derived from Mr Sturdy's researches, specially and exclusively with regard to live stock.

Also with the purpose of supplying illustrations and information pertaining to British East Africa, may I be honoured by the further privilege of drawing upon the excellent series of photographs of live stock taken by Mr Sturdy, some of which have been reproduced in the "Journal" of the Agriculture Department of British East Africa.
