Sir,

Referring to your letter of August 15th, I have just had the opportunity of meeting my colleagues who agree with me that while most anxious to proceed with the work, which has already been considerably delayed, it would hardly be reasonable to ask us to assume the full responsibility of spending a considerable sum of money on land, which may ultimately be found to belong to natives.

Supposing we did agree to select an area out of the Concession, could we rely upon the Government compensating us for any interference. I could not possibly ask my colleagues interested in this to risk their money on developing land under such precarious conditions unless we had some assurance that any loss incurred under such circumstances would be made good.
