Dear Sir,

We are instructed to write to you on behalf of clients of ours, a limited Company, who have had certain Leases granted to them in the British East Africa Protectorate under the Crown Lands Ordinance 1902.

Our clients contemplate going into voluntary liquidation and desire to be satisfied that this event will not work the forfeiture of their Leases.

We accordingly attended the Colonial Office to-day and inspected the Crown Lands Ordinance 1902 of the British East Africa Protectorate and also the various Rules made thereunder appearing in the Register of Ordinances and the Official Gazette from that date up to this year, in which we found nothing bearing upon the subject. We shall be obliged, therefore, if you can inform us whether there are any other, and if so what, Ordinances or Rules which would or might bear upon the subject.
