Sir,

We have the honour to report, in reference to your letter No. 21/561/1 dated 2.11.1912, re- Abdulla bin Abed, postal clerk, that we do not consider him fit for further service as a postal clerk.

He has been sick, off and on, for the last four or five years. He was an in-patient in this hospital for 13 days in 1909 with eczema and ulcers of the legs. He has frequently been treated by Dr. Lays, Dr. Casvallier, and ourselves, at various times. He is noted by Dr. Casvallier in the subordinate case book to have been frequently ill with malaria. He had a hydrocele of the scrotum tapped by me on the 16th. June, 1911. His general health is poor. He has scars of chronic ulcers (syphilitic) of the legs, these frequently break down, and heal up again under treatment with Potass. Iodidi.
