January 23rd, 1913.

Sir,

I have the honor to report that during the last few months several raids and murders have been traced to parties of unidentified natives who are on good ground believed to be members of the Maasai or the Parke's or Kita section of the Masai. It is clear on the western boundary of the South African Reserve. The details of each are briefly as follows:

(a) The murder of two Lumbwa men and one woman in the vicinity of the Mara river. The fragments of evidence procurable have been sufficient to implicate the Masai, without establishing the identity of the actual perpetrator.

(b) The attempted theft of some 40 head of cattle belonging to certain Lumbwa who were on the farm of a French settler adjoining their reserves, resulting in the death of three natives who

who were herding the stock. Here again the Masai have been proved to be the culprits, though no particular person can be charged with the crime.

(c) An attempted theft of stock in the South Kavirondo District in the course of which one native of the location attacked was killed. It is probable that the evidence forthcoming in this case will be sufficient to convict the guilty parties, all of whom are Masai.

(d) A raid into Turkana territory in the course of which 50 head of cattle were reported to have been stolen and one woman killed, and

(e) A theft of 10 head of cattle from natives residing in the East African. In both these cases the predatory parties are Masai.

2. Legalisation is requested to be making every effort to discover the offenders in each of these cases, but the evidence, except as regards (c), is of such a scanty description that I fear there is little hope of his success. No assistance in this respect has been given by the Sections implicated, all the members of which are doubtless fully conversant with the details. I consider therefore that the above indictment is sufficient to justify the imposition of a tribal punishment, and I have therefore ordered the infliction of a fine of 100 head of cattle on every village of the Parko or Loita Section of the Masai under the Collective Punishment

Ordinance 1909. There are 4 villages of the former Section and one of the latter, so that the total fine will amount to 500 head. I would moreover ask your sanction to devote the proceeds of the fine after the necessary blood money has been paid to the relatives of the murdered men, to works undertaken for the improvement of the Masai Reserve.

3. The present position is fraught with difficulties, as, unless the Masai are taught a severe lesson, these raids are bound to increase in numbers and gravity. The Lumi ya have evinced a royal confidence in the willingness and ability of the Government to protect them, but they cannot be expected to suffer much longer in silence, and drastic measures are necessary if they are not to adopt retaliatory tactics and inevitably bring about a serious encounter. I trust therefore that you will approve my action in the matter.
