The Governor stood out for the unmilled
timber rate being Rs. 2 per 100 c. ft. of all
merchantable timber in the land there.

The compromise now proposed gives the
Govt his way on the unmilled timber point
& reduces the milled rate to Rs. 1.38c. per 100
c. ft.

The matter has given a good deal of
trouble and if both parties are satisfied I
think we may approve

No. 23. My telegram 6th February No. 18. Grogan will accept terms under which he pays 1 rupee per hundred cubic feet of all merchantable timber not passing through mill, and two rupees of all merchantable timber not passing through mill. Conservator considers that boles contain not more than sixty per cent of merchantable timber in the tree. I consider the proposal the most favourable to Government which can be negotiated, and request your approval by telegram.
