The Suspense account has new worked very satisfactorily for some years, during which the scheme for the establishment of Prisons' Industries has been on its trial, and as the strict observance of the Regulation referred to would be well nigh impracticable, and certainly undesirable so long as provision for any fresh expenditure is contingent on the reduction of present expenditure or on an increase of revenue to double the amount, I have the honour to recommend adherence to the present system and to request your sanction to the relaxation of Colonial (Office) Regulation 307.

decided to curtail in some considerable degree the scope of Prisons' Industries at Nairobi Gaol: as far therefore as that institution is concerned the Suspense account will henceforth be of a restricted nature, but as it is not contemplated to extend this curtailment to Mombasa Gaol, it will still he necessary to keep open a Suspense account in order that the profit and loss may be accurately assertained.
