I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No.53 of the 22nd January on the subject of the new Leave Regulations.

- 2. It has been found that uncertainty as to the date on which officers will return to duty enhances the difficulty of arranging appointments here and I am therefore of opinion that it is undesirable to continue to give them the right of selecting the steamer which sails on the nearest date to the expiration of their leave in England, whether it happens to be after or before.
- 3. I am therefore in complete accord with the modification of the leave rules suggested in paragraph 3 of your despatch and would recommend its being brought into force at once.
