With reference to Mr.Read's letter of

February 4th, 1913, addressed to Mr.George
Lloyd M.P., copy of which formed an enclosure to
your despatch No.101 of the 5th of February last,

I have the honour to inform you that Mr.Lloyd,
who is at present on a visit to this Protectorate,
had several interviews with myself on the
subject of the Kenia forest and railway concession.

2. He has with my permission obtained information upon matters of local detail from the General Manager, Uganda Railway, and from the Acting Director of Public Works. He has also visited portions of the country beyond the Thika river, and has made considerable personal effort to acquire such knowledge of local conditions and requirements as will enable him to.
