

In reply to your Confidential despatch of the 6th ultimo respecting promotions in the Cadastral Branch of the Survey Department I have the honour to transmit herewith a copy of a letter from the Director of Surveys detailing the reasons for which he made the recommendations to which you refer.

2. It appears that Captain Williams has carefully considered the claims of the various officers concerned and I have no reason to doubt the correctness of his judgment. He must necessarily be in the best position to estimate the capacity of the members of his staff and I should be reluctant to question the justice of his decision.

Sir,

1. I have the honour to report that I recommended Messrs Fraser and O'Moloney for promotion to the rank of Senior Staff Surveyor in preference to Junior Staff Surveyors Messrs Harango, Poilbau, Bessler, Anderson and Macdonald for the following reasons:-

2. Messrs Fraser and O'Moloney are technically far better surveyors than the other above named Junior Staff Surveyors and are more experienced; they have proved themselves thoroughly reliable during their service in East Africa, and I consider that they will carry out the duties of Senior Staff Surveyors in every way satisfactorily.

3. I cannot recommend Messrs Harango or Bessler for promotion; their work as Junior Staff

Staff Surveyors is satisfactory, but they lack initiative, and I do not consider that they would carry out with efficiency a Senior Staff Surveyor's duties.

4. I am recommending shortly Mr. McIlwain for promotion to Senior Staff Surveyor to fill one more of the existing vacancies as I consider that he is now qualified for the post; but I should prefer him to be placed Junior on the list of Senior Staff Surveyors to Messrs Fraser and O'Meloney.

5. I cannot at present recommend Mr. Anderson for promotion, as his work lately has justified my previous decision to wait for improvement.

6. Mr. Macdonald has only during the last 18 months taken up cadastral work and although his work has been satisfactory, still compared with Messrs Fraser and O'Meloney he is only a beginner at cadastral work and will not be fitted for promotion for a considerable time.

7. I trust that this explanation will clearly show why I have recommended Messrs. Fraser and O'Meloney.

8. Mr. Ramsay is fully qualified for the post.
