I have been instructed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in his despatch No.134 of the 20th of February to communicate with you on the subject of the recruitment of Arab coolies for work in British East Africa.

- imposes on the employers of these labourers an obligation to arrange for adequate and suitable food and house accommodation for them and their dependents free of cost, and provided that a stipplation is made that the employers shall, at the end of the annual term of service or of any extension of their engagement, agree to repatriate the labourers, either at their own desire or at the request of one or both of our respective Governments, I am anxious to support the experiment.
- 3. I am of opinion, however, that in addition to the above provisos, conditions of a particularly strigent nature should be imposed

imposed on the employers with regard to the erection of heapitals, and the provision of medicines and medical attendants for the labourers. It would appear advisable for the contract to be framed in accordance with these requirements together with any others for the protection of the employees which you may see fit to impose.
