more particularly to paragraph A on the subject of educational facilities on the Yasin Plateau, and to transmit particulars of the post of Headmaster and Headmistress vacant to the Central School at Eldoret, which have been sanctioned in the estimate for the current financial year.

2. It is very desirable that the candidate selected should be a married couple, each with experience in teaching.

3. The Headmaster will be required to build up the School on the lines of a good English elementary school. He will also be responsible to the Director for the general education of the Plateau and will have rights of control over the other Schools, in order that these, with the Central

School may form one cohesive unit. The Central School is intended primarily for the children of English settlers and the Dutch language therefore will not be taught. Besides the usual subjects of elementary education particular attention will be given to physical development, hygiene and moral training.

The Headmistress, besides assisting the Headmaster in the teaching routine, will act as Matron for the school and will make all the necessary arrangements for the welfare of not more than thirty Boarders. She would also be able to attend to sick children.

5. The School will be conducted on the same lines as the Nairobi Day and Boarding School viz: Boarders at Rs. 30/- per month and Day scholars at Rs. 3/-, 1/- and 6/- per month according to Standard. The fees for journeys with Boarder, be provided. The fees for journeys without Boarder, be provided for one year and thereafter to increase in compliance with subsequent instructions received from you to that effect, should the necessity arise for the covering of the cost of tuition by part, at least, of the Boarding fees.

6. The Teachers' house will adjoin the establishment and, as at Nairobi, they will have their meals with the pupils at an exclusive charge of Rs. 30/- each per month.

obtained an interview from Mr.A.J.Turner Headmaster
of the European School Nairobi, who appears satis-
fied that Mr.Humphries would be a suitable man for
the position.

I further enclose forms shewing particulars
of the respective offices vacant and in the event
of the appointments being sanctioned by you, should
be glad if the selected candidates could leave for
East Africa at an early date.

in the Central School, Eldoret.

1. Duties of Office and qualifications required for their performance.

Applicant must have a thorough knowledge of the requirements of English Elementary Education. He should hold the Board of Education certificates in Teaching, (Handicrafts, Mathematics and Drawing, including Hygiene) and Elementary Science. He will be required to build up the school first beginning by taking charge of a number of boarders. He must be a married man whose wife will be able to hold the position of Headmistress. He will have the right of inspecting the minor schools on the plateau.

2. Salary of Office.

* £200 per annum.

3. Allowances, quarters, and other circumstances affecting the value of the Office.

Quarters will be allowed for himself and his wife free of rent but not of rates etc.,
