With reference to my despatch No. 382 of the 6th instant I have the honour to recommend that the district enclosing the Magadi Railway may be ranked as unhealthy for the purposes of leave.

2. There is at present no Government Station on the line, and the officers, consisting of an Assistant District Commissioner and an Inspector of Police, have consequently no housing accommodation. The water supply is described as bad, and several cases of enteric have occurred among the employees of the Company, while fresh food is frequently unobtainable. Moreover the heat experienced is at times extremely trying, especially in the region of the Lake, situated as it is at an altitude of some 2,000 feet only.
