LEGAL REPORT.

THE VACCINATION ORDINANCE, 1912.

The object of this Ordinance is to define the term "child" for the purposes of the Vaccination Ordinance 1912.

It is considered that having regard to the mixed population of this Protectorate the term "child" could most conveniently be defined so as to exclude persons of or over the age of 15 years.

This Ordinance has been passed on the recommendations of the Secretary of State and may be assented to and published forthwith.
