THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1913.

\*\*\*\*\*

1. The purpose of this Ordinance is to substitute for the Indian Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1890 applied to the Protectorate, an Ordinance modelled on the English Protection of Animals Act 1911.
2. The Ordinance is in my opinion a necessary and proper Ordinance for enactment in this Protectorate.

**THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1912.**

Sub-section (3) has been modified to make it lawful for any qualified Doctor or qualified Veterinary Surgeon to do any act which may lawfully be done in England by a person licensed under the Cruelty to Animals Act 1876.

Further the provisions of the Section are not restricted to <del>any</del> animals mentioned in Sub-section (4) of the Section in the English Act.</p>
