MEMORIAL TO THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

States that it is proposed to remove the monument  
in the central square at Kisumu. Request the Lieut. Govt  
to be informed of what it is proposed to do  
with a request for her views.

I got on 16/5/13 that Lady Stanger expressed  
her wish to have a sum of £1000 in the name of  
the monument to be set aside for the monument  
I have in C. of Subaland who again killed by Somali  
in 1900. The memorial wants to be useful to the  
nation. The money banks for the nation's better  
were looked with a view to a noble attitude.

It is clear from Lt. Govt's minutes on 22/5/13  
that the £1000 to be regarded as a  
casual receipt and credited to the Govt's account  
(see also minutes on 21/5/13 and letter to Lt  
on that paper which made the same). There was  
to be no fund set apart for the maintenance  
of the monument, but the Post Office was  
to be asked to keep it in repair, providing for  
such expenses on the 23rd inst.

The Govt in para 3 of this def. still speaks of  
the "monument fund" though a copy of your letter  
to CA on 22/5/13 was sent to the Post Office.

SIR,

I have the honour to refer to Lord  
Crewe's despatch No. 581 of 16th November 1908  
on the subject of the erection of a memorial  
at Kisumu to the late Mr. Arthur Jenner.

2. In the first instance the memorial  
took the form of a tank to hold rain water from  
the catchment area of two Military Barracks  
attached to which was a marble slab with an  
inscription sent by the Dowager Lady Jenner.  
These buildings have now been removed and the  
tank is in consequence rendered useless and  
the monument as a whole now presents a desolate  
and isolated appearance.

3. It is proposed, therefore, to remove  
the

the memorial and re-erect it in the central square of the town in front of the Baraza Hall which is also a Magistrate's Court. The tank will be provided with a tap and the marble tablet will be inserted into the wall above the entrance of the Hall. The amount standing to the credit of the memorial fund at the National Bank of India is Rs.168.15 cents and this will be sufficient to meet the cost of carrying the alteration in question into effect.

4. I consider that this would be a much more suitable arrangement, and would ask that the Dowager Lady Jemur be informed of what is proposed with the request that she will express her approval of the scheme should she have no preferable alternative suggestion to make.

to the central square of the  
town, in front of the Kisumu  
Hall, which is also a  
Magistrate's Court. The tank
