I have the honour to refer to Lord
Crewe's despatch No. 581 of 26th November 1908
on the subject of the erection of a memorial
at Kisimayu to the late Mr. Arthur Jenner.

2. In the first instance the memorial took the form of a tank to hold rain water from the catchment area of two Military Barracks attached to which was a marble slab with an inscription sent by the Dowager lady Jenner. These buildings have now been removed and the tank is in consequence rendered useless and the monument as a whole now presents a desolate and isolated appearance.

3. It is proposed, therefore, to remove

the memorial and re-erect it in the central square of the town in front of the Baroda Hall which is also a Magistrate's Court. The tanks will be provided with a tap and the marble tablet will be inserted into the wall above the entrance of the Hall. The amount standing to the credit of the memorial fund at the National Bank of India is Rs. 168.15 cents and this will be sufficient to meet the cost of carrying the alteration in question into effect.

4. I consider that this would be a much more suitable arrangement, and would ask that the Dowager Lady Jeypore be informed of what is proposed with the request that she will express her approval of the scheme should she have no preferable alternative suggestion to make.
