This copy of resolutions passed at the Conference of Veterinary Officers held at Bulawayo. The resolution as to serum was made on the offer of assistance made by Mr Steady. Understands Union of S.A. to apply at early date for 40,000 doses. Trusts that the necessary Suspense Account will be approved.

Prof. Steady's statement

This is the report in which was telegraphed yesterday. It is a pity that it did not arrive a day earlier. The account of the Conference, in so far as it affects P.A.P., is identical with that received by the B.S.A.C. Recall that Prof Steady's statement that P.A.P. is prepared to supply 25,000 doses per at one R. a dose. There is the proviso added "that the cost of the production of the serum is met in such a way that it does not appear in the Estimates of the Dept."

It is clear that the expenditure connected with the supply of serum to the countries will be quite ^{by P.A.P.} considerable, owing to the irregularity ^{and suddenness} of the demands made; and as it is urgent that P.A.P. should be placed in a position to meet present demands as soon as possible, it is recommended that a suspense account be opened.
