MEMORIAL TO THE BTR MR ARTHUR JENNER

States that it is proposed to remove and re-erect in the central square at Kisumu. Requests the Dowager Lady Jenner be informed of what it is proposed to do with a request for her views.

Mr. Blountley - Mr. Reed

In 1908 on 34/12/08 E.A.P. Lady Jenner expressed her wish to provide a sum of £1000 for the maintenance of a memorial to her son Mr Arthur Jenner, late C. of Subaland who was killed by Somalis in 1860. The memorial was to be useful to the nation. *Mr. Reed* under thanks for the national committee was touched, with an inscription on marble attached.

It is clear from Mr. Reed's minute of 30/1/08 that we intended the £1000 to be regarded as a Central receipt and credited to the Govt Revenue (see also minute on 4/1/01 and letter to CA on that paper which made this clear). There was to be no fund set apart for the maintenance of this Memorial, but the Post was to be debitable to keep it in repair, providing for such expenses on the Eschinate.

The Govt in para 3 of this despatch speaks of the "Memorial fund" though a copy of an letter to CA on 4/1/08 was sent to the Post.

I have the honour to refer to your despatch No. 171 of March 6th and to report that the ~~cat's~~ nine tails is only used for carrying out sentences of flogging in the case of adults, juvenile offenders being whipped with a light cane imported from India, which I have satisfied myself is a suitable instrument for the purpose and conforms with the views expressed by the Prison Commissioners.

2. I have accordingly issued instructions that this cane is to be employed in the infliction of all floggings ordered in future whether of adults or juveniles and that an adequate supply is to be sent for at once from India.

As far as I can ascertain there is no indigenous cane
