& saw Mr. Bondjard (the City Manager) by  
appointment, & after having considered  
the matter for some time he  
promised me that if I were to  
send in my resignation from the  
Railway Service, my application for  
transfer to the West Coast would  
be forwarded to the proper quarters.  
It was entirely on this understanding

that I was induced to write out my resignation, & my letter applying for transfer was despatched in the same envelope.

In the City Managers letter of acknowledgement of my resignation he distinctly states that my application for transfer to another colony had been forwarded to the proper quarters, & I was given to understand that my name would go down for re-employment if the application was approved in London.

When I arrived in London three and a half months afterwards I was surprised to hear that no application had been sent. I should certainly not have resigned had I known that things would turn out as they have done - for I left had I been absolutely penniless and my wife with me, & up to the present have been unable to obtain

any other employment, chiefly  
 on account of having no papers  
 or any record to show for the  
 time served in British East Africa,  
 which embraced nearly two years.  
 I was promised promotion  
 in a letter dated 9/2/09 No. 1002/100 hands  
 to join King's; but when the  
 time came an officer junior to me  
 was given the vacancy, & after that  
 the prospect seemed hopeless, &  
 Mr Sandford wrote me a letter  
 saying that he considered it was  
 no doubt very difficult for me to  
 manage (being married) on my small  
 salary, & that it was not the proper  
 position for me as a junior officer.  
 Trusting that this letter will  
 be given your esteemed consideration  
 & subsequent action,
