









PROVISIONAL MAP

I have the honour to refer to paragraph six of my despatch No. 476 of the 23rd of June, in which I reported the arrangements I have made for the administration of the Serenli District including the control of the Marchan in the North and the Aulihan in the South, and to inform you that I propose, subject to your sanction, to grant half the Civil duty allowance of £40 per annum, which is attached to Serenli station, to the Military Officer in charge of that station, in accordance with the principle laid down in Section 181 of the King's African Rifles Regulations.
