With reference to your despatch No. 493 of the 27th of June respecting the vacancy for an Assistant in the Treasury, I have the honour to inform you that by the death of Mr. R. N. Evans, which I reported to you in my telegram No. 175 of the 28th ultimo, it will be necessary to make fresh arrangements with regard to the filling of the post.

2. In the absence of any suitable local candidates I should be glad if an officer from outside the Protectorate Service could be appointed to the vacancy, particulars of which were forwarded under cover of my despatch No. 405 of the 27th of May last.

Treasury Assistant (£250-45-£4000) & EAP

senior he is the best of the Uganda European
Treasury Subordinates. There is no doubt

that he should be considered for the
best Uganda vacancy, but EAP may prefer
a man direct from home to one who has
served in a subordinate position on
second class agreement.
