

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 499 of the 27th of June respecting the introduction of a system of allowances and advances for motor vehicles, and to transmit herewith for your information a list of applications for all such allowances, including those in respect of bicycles, which have up to the present been refused.

2. You will observe that the refusal of an application is comparatively rare and in fact is, except in the case of the Game Warden, confined to officers resident in Nairobi who make use of bicycles or motor bicycles between their offices and their bungalows. I should, however, add that a considerable number of applications for the allowance in respect of a motor bicycle have been held over pending your final decision in the matter.

3. As I have already stated in my despatch No. 363 of the 13th of May, I am in favour of the grant of the allowance to all officers who must travel regularly and who should be encouraged to use bicycles in the performance of their duties, but I cannot recommend its extension to those officers whose work

approves, so S.C. will inform Govt.
