Sir,

I have the honour to report the circumstances under which I recommend that a pecuniary award should be granted in respect of the recovery of 43 tusks of buried ivory in the Mumias District.

2. The ivory, which was recovered and conveyed into the Station, was retrieved owing to the energy and perseverance of two native Police Constables, Mariathabu and Nandi Adeti by name, after further search for it appeared fruitless.

3. The first named Constable, who was chiefly instrumental in the recovery of the ivory, is known to be a man of integrity and fidelity. He is shortly retiring after ten years' service and without a pension. He has nothing therefore to expect from his Department and I consider this to be a fitting occasion where he may be suitably rewarded for his years of faithful service.

4. I am further of opinion that this is a case where the good services rendered were outside the scope of the ordinary duties of a Police Constable
