REWARDS FOR RECOVERY OF BURIED IVORY

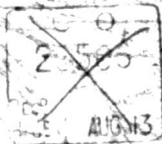

Paraphrase of telegram from The Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 6.55.p.m., 71st July, 1913.)

July 31st Have received your telegram July 29th. It is recommended by Simpson that a considerable area should be acquired by Government north west of existing native town where new native and Indian locations could be laid out, also that we should take the opportunity of acquiring other areas as European residential sites. Holey occasionally has opportunity of acquiring small blocks of land quietly. I recommend therefore that he may be placed in position to close with offers. I undertake that in making purchases the greatest caution will be exercised. Owing to variations in prices demanded estimate of cost is impossible. It was suggested that £50,000 would be probably sufficient to cover the cost of this scheme, and also to cover cost of any purchases suggested or accomplished previously.
