No. 176. Your telegram 23rd July, on strong
recommendation of Professor Simpson, proposed to
borrow Skelton and some of his subordinate staff from
Zanzibar for two months plague duty Mombasa.

Spurrier consents to take his place while he is away
and Government of Zanzibar agree. I (we) should
pay for any extra expense involved. Trust you will
sanction.
