Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 474 of the 19th of June respecting the Supplementary Estimate of the East Africa Protectorate for the financial year 1912-13, and to inform you that information will in future be given as far as possible (a) as to the excesses on sub-heads making up the total excess on the vote, and (b) as to the savings which have been, or may be, effected. I would, however, venture to emphasize the difficulty experienced in attempting to base the figures of the Supplementary Estimate on completed accounts for a portion, say eight months, of the year, especially as the work in connection with the Estimates generally and the ancillary returns has of late increased to a great extent.

2. With reference to paragraph 3 of your despatch I propose that a supplementary statement be attached to Appendix V of the Financial Report showing in the case of each service what amount was spent during 1912-13, and what amount will still have to be
