but para 19 of the enclosure to 19227 contains
a recommendation by Mr. Goring that the
two posts should be filled by the appointments

- 1. Mr G. P. Lewis Esq. P.M.S. Walker Hospital
New Lites, Parkersville, Maryland
- and

2. Mr. Pearson Esq. class Public Works, E.H.P.

Mr. Goring apparently thinks that Mr. Pearson is
suitable for one of the posts, and if this is so
he should certainly be provided, rather than
have a man brought in from outside. But
we really cannot say definitely what the
Government wishes are as he both asks us
to file from home and also refers us to
Mr. Goring's wishes, which in the 45 posts
should be filled by persons already in the
Colonial service.

I should be inclined to telegraph to him
and enquire whether he supports Mr. Goring's

proposal that he should Mr. Pearson should
have one of the posts. If so, Mr. Pearson
could be promoted and the other appointment
filled by an officer from home or be offered
to Mr. Lewis or Mr. Lites.

The filling of the posts is a matter of
urgency so I think we should telegraph
without waiting for the despatch which
it is said, is following.
