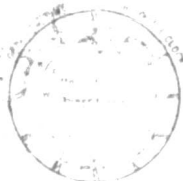

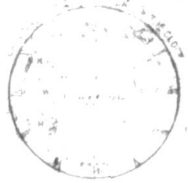

The Deputy Governor of the East Africa Protectorate
to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

No. 156. Professor Simpson most strongly urges immediate engagement of six medical officers for special plague duty at Mombasa. Further urges expenditure of about £7,000 during remainder of current financial year for other staff equipment, and incidental expenditure. Plague appears to have established itself generally throughout town to an extent previously unrecognised probably owing to concealment of cases. Request authority to meet all expenditure recommended by Simpson without reference further, up to limit of £7,000 as health of part of population of importance and action cannot be delayed. If approved six medical officers should be sent out at very earliest possible opportunity on engagement for one year. Necessary qualifications for post Tropical School and if possible diploma Public Health.
