MOMBASA MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt
of your despatch No. 366 of the 15th of May respecting
the formation of a Municipal Council for Mombasa.

2. I would venture to submit, however, that it
would be advisable to defer the application of the
Municipal Ordinance to that city for twelve months
and to state the reasons which prompt me to make
this recommendation.

3. In the first place, the town is not at present
in a fit condition to hand-over to a Municipal
Council. There are for instance no roads worthy of
the name, with the exception of that leading to the
Port of Kilindini.

4. Secondly, the residents of Mombasa are lacking
in that experience of Municipal matters which it is
essential that they should possess before the
Municipality can be effectively administered.

5. Thirdly, the town is confronted with many
difficult and delicate problems which I submit
require full discussion if future misunderstandings

are to be avoided. Of these the most important are, the position of the town with regard to the water supply, the position of the town with regard to the possible formation of a Port Trust, and the assets which can be adduced as interest for any loan which it may be necessary to raise for improvements.

6. I have therefore authorized the Provincial Commissioner to meet the Chamber of Commerce and to ask them to nominate a Committee of some five representatives to confer with him and the principal officers of the Government in Mombasa with a view to considering the whole question and preparing a tentative budget for the coming year. An advisory Township Committee will then be formed with an experienced Town Clerk to administrate the Municipal Office and its administration.

7. I feel sure that the formation of a municipality will be welcomed by the residents of Mombasa, but this preliminary action is necessary if they are to administer it with justice from its inception.
