I have the honour to confirm my
telegram No. 187 of yesterday's date as follows:-

"Governor certified as unable to attend to
the duties of his office owing to severe attack
of subterfuge malarial with heart complications.
At Governor's request am taking oath tomorrow
as Officer Administering Government under
Section XV Order in Council 1906.

2. I have now the honour to enclose a
report on Mr Belfield's health which was handed to
me by Dr Gilks the Medical Officer in attendance.

3. Mr Belfield instructed me, through his
Private Secretary, to take over the administration
of the Government of the Protectorate during his
inability and, there being no Judge of the High
Court who was able to attend, the prescribed oaths
were accordingly administered to me this morning
by the Treasurer in the presence of the senior
officials who were in Nairobi.
