TELEGRAM:

The ~~Government~~ of the ~~African Protectorate~~ to the Secretary of State for the ~~Colonies~~,

(Received Colonial Office, 7.35 p.m. 29th August 1913.)

August 29th. Nomusa land. Your cypher telegram  
 August 2nd, My Confidential despatch of July 29th, No.  
 95. \* Simpson's detailed scheme laying out Nomusa  
 Island is not sufficiently far advanced to enable me  
 to forward the map by the next mail. I again dis-  
 cussed with him the position while Hobley was present,  
 and I am more especially convinced that further  
 acquisitions of land should be made with the least  
 possible delay. If you are not able pending the receipt  
 of detailed proposals to accede to the request contained  
 in my cypher telegram of July 29th, I request earnestly  
 that £12,000 be allowed to enable Hobley to make further  
 purchases. The £12,000 now asked for would include  
 the three items which are referred to in the latter  
 part of my confidential despatch of July 29th. This  
 sum is additional to the £14,500 already sanctioned.
