Sir,

With reference to your letter of July 13th, and the question of my employment under the East Africa Protectorate, I have been given to understand at the Foreign Office that, I am required to return to Adis Ababa for the purpose of assisting the British Minister there to finally settle the British East Africa and Abyssinia Frontier.

Under these circumstances, I venture to put forward for the favourable consideration of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, my request that during my sojourn in Abyssinia on the above business I may be allowed, as a special case, the subsistence allowance of Ten shillings a day, as the cost of living at Adis Ababa is very considerably more than on the frontier.

Herewith I enclose a Statement of expenses incurred by me from this ... to Djibouti.
