I wrote to Mr Heathcote and you
last night on 27/485 of P.C.R. - am now
further letter from him attached to 27/485

It can no objection to the correction rather
than the deletion of the passage in Mr Stanley's
report which are referred to as in error.
He also sends a further list of incorrect
passages - (letter of 24 Sept) - this is presumably
the last bit - "the minor corrections" referred
to in Mr Heathcote's letter of 5th Sept.

You will observe that two of the corrections coincide
with corrections suggested in the first list.
None of them are very extensive and it is
possible that the pass' which it is suggested
should be deleted, are merely superfluous and
do not admit of correction.
(I have marked the corrections in pencil on the
copy of the Report).
What we ought now is write to the B.S.A Co

referring to semi-official correspondence in the
M² Heath case, ask whether the list of
conclusions suggested in the letter from the
Administrator's Dept. dated September
20th Sept 1913; and if not ask whether
the Co have any objection to the publication
of Dr. Storck's report subject to these conclusions
being made: adding that Prof. H. recommends
that the parts "which it is proposed to
delete are superfluous as well as incorrect
and so cannot be corrected."
