I have the honour to refer to my Confidential Mempatch No. 119 of the 12th of September and to forward herewith copies of correspondence which has been received from the Officer in Charge, Northern Frontier District regarding the situation on the Abyesinian Boundary.

2 With reference to the 10th paragraph Mr. Hope's letter of the 25th of August, the musting of placing half a company of troops in the care country will he discussed with the officer Commending Troops and the Inspector Coneral. I have the bonour to inform you that on
22nd instant I sent scouts out from Drouli wife is
about 18 miles south of Gaddaduma and found Fitewari
Waldi had arrived there. I therefore wrote asking him
to meet me at Guran about in miles south of Gaddaduma
and just south of the red line.

- 2. On 24th instant I moved camp to Gurar and tound Fitamari Waldi had gidden over and was waiting for me.
- his willingness to help in every way he could.
- 4. He informed me that he was putting men at all the wells on their side so as to eatch Tigre if they came there.
- fig. He told me that his orders from Fitaliani
 Hapts deorgis were to look for Tigre only and did not
 mention crossing the boundary but he said if I wished.

- plan if he would come to Guffolf Dandu and Gader with me as it is at these places that the Tigre generally live and if they had collected in any number, the force I had at my disposal was not sufficient for dealing with them. He accordingly agreed to meet me at Guffoli on the 26th instant with 200 men and proceed with me to Dandu a and Gader.

- 7. His general attitude was friendly and he seemed willing to do what he could to help.
- 8. I am afraid we shall not find any Tigre as they must know of our movements and will probably have cleared away to the Dawa.
- 9. Fitaruari waldi informs me that if they do clear off to Abyssinian side they will be caught.
- 10. If feel sure that in a few months the Tigre will appear again in tarre country and therefore most urgently requested that a half company of troops may be detailed from Serenii for that district so that we can deal with the matter ourselves.
- 11. It is almost proved that the Garre Chief Ali an Andi has been hand in glove with Tigre always and has connected them when Captain Aylmar was in his country.
- 12. I sa going to have him up before us at Gader and if it is proved to my satisfaction I phonose as asking him for permission to deport him.
- 18. The fact of wald having min at all the walls will mean that Boran who have run away from Abyssinian territory will be recaptured when they have to water their stock meet of the red line which they will have to do in the dry weather. I have warned the Boran of min this and that they return north of the red line at their own risk.
- 14. I have the bonour to request that you will inform our Minister at Adis Ababa or my having met Pitaruari and of our plans.

Sir.

I have the honour to report that on 16th
August I received a letter from Fitaruari Waldi informing
me he had arrived at Mega and would be at Gaddaduma on
21st August.

Accordingly I arrived at Daronli about is miles from Gadduduma and south of the red line on 21st August and on 22nd August sent on some mounted Soulis to reconnoitre.

I did this as the day I left hoyale a runner had come in that 200 Abyssinians were waiting for me at Gaddaduma and as Waldi had seemed to delay I was suspecious.

They arrived at Gaddaduma and found Waldi had arrived the might before and was on the look out for me.

He wrote me a letter maying he was at my disposel and would like to know what I months wanted him to do.

As he had a very big came with many seen I thought it as well not to go into Gaddaduma, so as to avoid any trouble at the wells, and moved to Gurar about 9 miles from Gaddaduma and wrote asking Pitaruari Waldi to meet me thatma.

I arrived at Gurar on E4th Angust and I found ().

He applicated for his delay saying he did not realize I was in a hurry.

He said he had had orders to test for Tigre but had not been told to go into Erralen territory but he was willing and keen to help me in every way and would do wahtever I thought was best.

He was leaving men at all the wells and sending men to the wells north of Gaddaduma along the boundary to Eil Chillako.

Reports had come into me of Tigre at Bandua.

Gader and Jara so I teld him I thought it would be a
good thing if he would come with me via Guffeli. Dandu M
ander as Tar as Jara.

I told him I would fetch All Abdi so that he could ask him may questions.

He agreed to do this at once and on his asking.
how many men he should take I told him I thought 200
would be sufficient.

We then mareed to meet at Guffeli.

I told him about the rimour re the 200 men and he said it was absurd.

We met at Guffell on 26th August.

We then saw one of the Carre who had been wounded in the recent fight between Carre and Tigre near Dandu.

The Carre had been afraid to go near Deadh since so could not say if there were Tigra there or not.

Next day we left for Dandu sending some scents wheed but there were no stans of Tigre having been there recently though we saw where they used to live.

The following day we moved on to Oader and en route we passed a small hill on which Fitaruari Waldi saw some buts but in going there we found they had not been used for about I month.

It was evidently one of the Tigre hiding places.

At Gader we comped at the hill where one of my caravans coming from Merchan country encountered and killed 2 Tigre about one month ago.

Here again they had a hiding place in the rocks.

I rode with Pitaruari Waldi to see the place where Captain Alymer was killed. It was fairly open country near this hill with bush near the foot of it.

We saw the tree, about 10 inches in diameter, behind which Captain Aylmer stood when he was shot end the bullet apparently went throught the tree getting him just about the heaft.

We exemined the hill and discovered the remains of a-

All the bills are rocky Konyes and warm ten or twenty men could easily repulse a small body of men attacking them.

Near Gader I heard of an Abyssinian who had run away from his country about six months ago and had become a Mchommedan and lived with a Garscheadman.

The Carre had never reported his presence and we only knew at it from the Abyasinians.

The Abysainians had asked for him before as he was implicated in the raid on Yahen and it was for this reason be had run away.

I went out and had him arrested.

Is I am of opinion that he was originally mixed up with the Tigre I thought it best to hand him over to Pitaruari which who promised to send him to Adia Ababaas I think it might help to bring out some evidence refigere.

He He denied all inovietge of Tigre of of having

having invited them into the country but I am convinced he did so and propose asking for leave to deport him to Nairobi.

At present relations between Garre and Tigre are strained as the latter lately killed an important Garre near Derkali.

While at Cater I got knews of a large party of Absseinians who had crossed the river Dawn at Melks Murri and gone to Bodee near the frontier close to Chillako.

We therefore move on to Eil Roba in the Jara

there we mund that 5 days before our arrival a party of 24 Tigre had respect form living near Bil Roba

Faiyu Aba Sora the headman of the village stated that the Tigre were at Eil Der first and come and took 4 mosts and 1 ex.

Then they came to dark and took 15 denkeys 2 conteand 20 cloths and moved asky to degithe north of burdures in Abyesinian territory.

The Boren had tracked them there and say that they had left cuguible and gone further into Abyseinian territory.

licensed hunter and so this may be a more or less legitimate hunting party.

They had also moved north into Abyssiniai.

The scouts whom I had sent on to Jara saw tracks of mules and people near one of the hills in Jara so I sent out to have them followed.

This morning a ferre come in and said he met about 40 people on ponies and mules waiting at a water hole.

They caught him and took his water pot and shoes and he saw many mare people some way away.

They asked him all the hows of the country and where

Then they went off towards E11 Der and Burdurras.

Pitaruari Saidi shinks this must be a party of his people looking for him but he has ment out mounted men to see, as they had not routed any villages I think it probably is so.

Pitaruari Weldi has promised to recover the

way west from here it is difficult to say on which aide one would be.

It is apparently no use my going any further with walds so tomorrow I am returning and he is going to all low to hunt up the party of 25 we heard about.

I am very glad I have met Pitaruari Waldi. He seems a very superior sort of man and has my expressed his intention of helping me in every way and seems very ricent friendly.

He is coming to live at More which is 4 days
exect of Moyale and I think that in future matters may run
more smoother. He is very sensiale in his views and ready

to meet one half way.

Our meeting has been most satisfactory although we failed to eatch any Tigre out they have uncommedly gone north and I hope Waldi will eatch them.

I have told him to follow them if they break back to dark or finder and to let me know.

I very much fear that after a few months the Figre will appear again and told walds so. He said he would try his best to prevent it.

I hear Dyaz Balcha is eatching anyone who has not got a master or who cannot give a satisfactory account of himself and has arrested many people.

I have heard nothing about the Yahen compensation.

I have not heard anything, further than your letter about the repayment of stock leoted from Gapbra at Markona.

I have sent a letter to Dyes Madrid through Weldi but

Pitaruari Waldi told me he intended catching the Boren, who ran away, when they have to return to water on their side but he has promised that his men will not catch the boundary after them.

Should the Abyesinian Government eventually agree to the rectification of the boundary I fear that with the present force here we would have great difficulty in occupying it as the local officials would be read against it. We would be sure to find bands of so called Tigre at all the wells and we would not get much help from the local officials.

The loss of boran is a very serious matter to them as it is equivalent to having their private means greatly diminished and the loss of a great number of loren. Trade. The whole frontier from Tare to Waiye is now full of rinderpest.

Owing to the recent state of affairs I have stopped all traders coming up at present but there are a fair number still here.

I am quarantining all cattle at Marsabif for 20 days.

Cattle are at present high in price 80 to 85 dollars

For cows but next Jame when waldt bells me he is going
to collect the tax again I expect the price will drop.

I think I received all the letters you mention.

B. M's Minister Adia Ababa. Statement of Abba Bunda, Abyasinian subject arrested at village of Abbilli Alyo a Garre near Gader.

I came to Abdilli's village about one year age to sell buni and Abdilli told me to stay with him. I became a Mohammedan and I lived with him as his son since. I used to live at Gaddaduma but being afraid of Tigre I came into the Garre country. Since the darre and Tigre fought near Guffoli about six weeks ago I have not seen any Tigre. I used to Arbitrate in disputes between Garre and Tigre then they had rows. I used to belong to Balamburas Waldi Gabriel but ran away because I was starved.

I know the names of two Tigre who live in Sidnes, country. They are both sailed Aba Licha by Borns and one of them is called Atto Jambari by Abyssinians.

All the figre come from Balche's country Jun Junta.

The men killed by Carre near Cuffoli were soldiers
of Balche.

I went against the Yahen to hely Abdilli whose friends I was. Markos the Greek at Barrow supplied me with cartridges to hunt with.

All Abdi told me that he had informed Captain
Aylmer I was living with the Garre and therefore there
was no need for me to so and see him. Every one knows that
All Abdi and Adm Smalm invited Abyseinians from as far as
Crillake to come and fight Yaham.

on being brought before fitament Waldi in the France presence Abba Mandda stated:

I took my discharge from Balamburas Waldi Gabriel and was with Basha Sangal at Gaddadnma. I went with Basha Sangal and other Tigre to help the game against Yahen. It was sometime after that that I went to live with the Garre.

Basha Songal was leader of the Tigre and after

that Abe Shango, Talafi Aleyo, Balacha who was one of Zaniblo's men and another 7 by Zaphiro's men whose name I don't know were at Gader at the time. They had come from Sidamo through Enlo and had left them their safari at Sulo.
