Sir,

I have the honour to state, in reply to your despatch No 198 Africa of the 19th instant, that I am unfortunately unable to give the information desired respecting the claim made by the Tangana and Sherifu to certain land believed to be the property of Government on the island of Tombasa. I have no recollection of the transaction mentioned by Mr Pigott, as reported in Mr Hollis' letter of the 12th instant. Matters of this description were ordinarily dealt with by the Sub-Commissioner of the Province, though I have little doubt that, in accordance with the usual custom, this purchase was submitted and explained verbally to me by whoever was acting for Mr Pigott, probably the late Mr Crauford, during his temporary illness. But I should certainly not have sanctioned it on the mere representation of Mohamedin, whom I knew well and did not respect, or indeed of any but a British Officer.
