Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State for India to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 22403 of the 23rd May respecting the grant of British and German flags to dhows in the Persian Gulf, and in reply to say that he concurs in the proposal of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to approach the German Government in the manner indicated by you.

The measures taken by the British East African authorities appear to be generally adequate, but in the case of persons who may be of mixed origin I am to suggest that the procedure proposed by the Political Agent in paragraph 1 of his letter of 23rd September 1912 be adopted with a discretionary provision.
