With reference to paragraph 3 of Your Excellency's despatch No. 63 Commercial of the 18th of April last, respecting the interpretation of the Paris Sanitary Conventions of 1901 and 1912, I have now ascertained that the Zanzibar Government concur in the view that native trade only between German East Africa and Zanzibar should not come under those Conventions and I request that you will inform the German Government accordingly.

The question of the adherence of British East Africa to the Sanitary Conventions of 1901 and 1912 is still under consideration.
