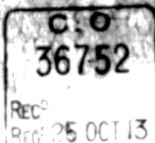

With reference to Earl Granville's despatch No. 35 of this series of the 1st instant, I have the honour to transmit herewith a publication issued by the Imperial Colonial Office dealing with the protection of game in the German Colonies.

This volume is the result of an enquiry addressed in 1911 and 1912 to all the local administrative authorities of the Protectorates, and contains exhaustive information with regard to the animals found in various districts of the Protectorates, legislation regulating hunting, descriptions of the conditions prevailing with regard to game in the various districts, and a number of maps showing the locality of the game reserves.
