Berlin, January 31, 1907.

WITH reference to your despatch No. 179, Africa, of the 27th November, 1906, I have the honour to transmit herewith a copy of a translation of a note from Herr von Tschirschky stating that the German Government agree to the proposed alteration in the text of Article 3 of the Agreement, signed on the 18th July, 1906, upon the subject of the Anglo-German boundary east and west of Lake Victoria.

(Translation.)

THE Undersigned has the honour to inform Sir Frank Lascelles as follows in reply to the note of the British Charge d'Affaires, of the 1st December, 1906, on the subject of certain alterations in the text of the Agreement, signed on the 18th July, 1906, regarding the Anglo-German boundary east and west of Lake Victoria.

The Imperial Government agrees that Article 3 of the said Agreement shall be altered as follows:—

"The pillar marking the boundary, as defined above, shall determine its course even in the event of future alteration of their geographical co-ordinates"

"It is agreed that the 30th meridian east of Greenwich is about 10 seconds true west of pillar No. 1, west of Lake Victoria."
