Sends list of urgent works which it is intended
to take in hand up to amount of £10,000.

W. Read.

This paper has had to wait till I could
get back from calculation the Estimates
as approved by the Treasury.

It was possible to provide in those
Estimates £20,000, instead of £15,000
for Railway Special Expenditure. So
P. Girouard had to make his own selection
up to the amount of £20,000, out of the
list of urgent works put forward by
the Major of the Railway (copy
attached to Govt. 39993/10). Some of the
items which appear in this despatch are

not included in the list inserted in
the Estimates (see p. 75(a) of the copy
of the Estimates herewith).

We next point this out, & say
that, when they revise the draft Estimates
in accordance with the conditions on
which they have been approved, they
should amend Schedule 22 a. so as
to include all the work begun before
the 1st April, but without exceeding the
total provision of £20,000 for 1905-6.
