I have collected a ^{small} amount of infⁿ which I have put on the accompanying sheet. Sir C. Hunter asks for figures for the years "1906" and "1912". It is difficult to know what to give him, as the figures don't appear to have been given in the Annual Blue Book Report 1906 & the latest return for 1912 ~~the account~~ which has been received (Capt. Quarter).

As to the Police I have taken the figures from the Annual Blue Book Report 1906

and the approved Est. for 1912-13 - we
cannot, I think, give any closer
figures.

As to the white population, the
census for 1911 can be taken, we
have nothing further for 1912 - for
1906 - see Annual Blue book Report 1906-7.
