Mr. HARCOURT: I understand that the recent congestion at the lake ports and on the railway has been relieved. One of the new cargo steamers for the lake is expected to be launched very shortly, and the material for a second steamer is already on the spot. The new lighter-tug which is to be employed in the Keweenaw Gulf will also be launched shortly. With these new boats and the considerable amount of new rolling stock which is coming forward for delivery, I trust that it will be possible to deal temporarily with the expansion of trade. I am now considering, as I stated in my reply to the hon. Member for East Nottingham on the 18th June, what further action it is desirable and practicable to take, and I hope next year to be able to commence a considerable further expenditure for these purposes.

Captain GILMOUR: Can the right hon. Gentleman say when the new rolling stock will be delivered?

Mr. HARCOURT: No, I cannot say the date. It is coming forward very rapidly.
