I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 31st ultimo (28/1/1913) and its accompanying copy of a telegram from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate submitting proposals for improving the water supply in the Masai reserve in the Protectorate.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that in the circumstances represented My Lords give Their covering sanction for the immediate commencement of the work, on the understanding that the expenditure which may be incurred during the current financial year can be met from savings on the sanctioned Estimates of the Protectorate without reduction in the Estimate of the surplus balance on the 31st proximo on the basis of which the draft Estimates for 1913-14 have been prepared.


