
In the circumstances represented by Mr. Secretary Harcourt in Mr. Read's letter of the 7th instant (3973/1913) the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury sanction the assignment as from the 1st April next of duty allowances of £60 per annum and £50 per annum respectively to Lieutenant Reynolds, Marine Superintendent, and Mr. Grant Superintendent Engineer, Marine Department, Uganda Railway.

The above authority is given on the understanding that the amount involved (£110) will be covered by modifications of other items of expenditure included in the draft Protectorate Estimates 1913-14 so as to restrict the total expenditure of the Protectorate to the maximum admissible under the modified half and half principle.
