I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 8th January last (36677/1912) and its enclosures on the subject of house allowances in the East African Protectorates.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that My Lords sanction in the case of officers serving in Nyasaland the revised scale proposed by Major Pearce of allowances in lieu of quarters, which would also be taken for pension purposes in the case of officers occupying free quarters.

My Lords also concur in the proposal to approve the addition to the rules for the grant of house allowances in the East Africa Protectorate of the proviso recommended by the Acting Governor of that Protectorate, which they note will apply to Uganda also.
