I am directed by the Lords Commissioners to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Read's letter of the 15th instant (16072/1913) transmitting copies of the final estimates of Revenue and expenditure of the East Africa Protectorate for the year 1913-14.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr Secretary Hargourt that My Lords approve the modifications which have been made in the Estimates and, on the understanding that no excess will be caused on the expenditure permissible under the half and half principle, They give Their covering authority for the insertion of the following items therein:-

## Head 19

Contribution to Nairobi Municipality	£
for lighting streets and roads	240
Grant to Imperial Institute	350

## Head 23

Coffee Plant Inspector	400

With regard to the first of these items I am to say, with reference to Mr. Read's letter of the 14th instant (14312/1913), that My Lords give Their approval as a temporary measure only in the exceptional circumstances of the case and without prejudice to the claim against the Nairobi Municipality for repayment of the sum expended on the installation of the lighting service.
