Mr. Reed has suggested the substitution of a list of Part African Medical Officers after the style of the N.A.M.S. List (attached)

There will be several differences:-

- ① The P.A. M.O's are not all on Staff, as the N.A.M.S. so that officers according to rank (pp 5-9) will not appear in the P.A.M.S. List. We shall only need the second list according to Colonies.
- ② There is a uniform scale of salaries for all officers of the N.A.M.S., irrespective of the colony in which they are serving. Salaries for M.O's in East Africa are not uniform. It may therefore be necessary to mention salaries of officers in the East African Medical List.

As there is no "S. A. M. S." a different form
of title will be required - e.g. "List of Medical
Officers serving in the Protectorates in Eastern
Africa."

- The impossibility of grouping grades will
deprive the list of one of the most useful features
of the W. A. M. S. list.
