The present regulations are not altogether satisfactory, I think, as what apparently holds good for Part does not hold good for Leprosy, whereas in fact the regulations are the same for both untreated leprosy. I suggest:-

(c) add to sub-para. ² the words "subject to his first obtaining the sanction of the Governor to study the ~~that particular language~~ ⁱⁿ which he desires to be examined
