The present regulations are not altogether satisfactory, I think, as what apparently holds good for Part does not hold good for Leprosy, whereas in fact the regulations are the same for both untreated leprosy. I suggest:-

(c) add to sub-para. <sup>2</sup> of the word subject to his first obtaining the sanction of the Governor to study the ~~that particular language~~ <sup>in</sup> which he desires to be examined

Why not adopt the Govt wording? i.e. Officers, whether civil or military, are expected to satisfy the Governor <sup>by examination</sup> within one year after arrival in the Protectorate that they possess a good colloquial knowledge of English.
